

CHARTREUSE BUZZARDS RETURN TO SPREAD THE NEWS OF MACY

The Edith Macy Girl Scout National Center, near Briarcliff Manor, N.Y., has served as a Girl Scout National Training Center for more than 75 years.

Following the construction of the original building, Great Hall, by Juliette Low, the founder of the Girl Scout movement, the magic of Macy has touched the lives of thousands of adult and girl members who have been there.

Introduced in 1974 by an innovative group of Macy alumnae, as a way to provide some financial support, sales of the Chartreuse Buzzard patches has generated about \$25,000 by 2003. The patches are now worn by Girl Scout girls and adults in many Councils across the country and by Girl Scouts overseas. Funds have been raised to help complete the Edith Macy Conference Center, the John J. Creedon Camp of Tomorrow, to contribute to the Edith Macy Scholarship Fund, and to add to the fund to refurbish the Great Hall for its 100th birthday.
