

Earning the Girl Scout Silver Award

The Girl Scout Silver Award is the highest award in Cadette Girl Scouting. To earn this award you must complete recognitions which will help you explore careers, develop your leadership potential, learn new skills and will challenge you to give something of yourself and make an impact on your community. Then you must design and carry out a Girl Scout Silver Award Project.

When girls work on the project as a troop, each girl must have her own specific responsibilities and be able to define her own unique contribution.

Not every Cadette Girl Scout chooses to complete the requirements for this award, however you and some members of your troop may want to work on activities toward the Silver Award. With the help and support of your leader, you can do these activities and have lots of fun along the way!

In this packet are many guidelines and helps which you may find useful as you plan for the Silver Award. The only deadline for this award is that it must be completed while a girl is a registered Cadette Girl Scout.

When you finish all the requirements for this award, complete the <u>Girl Scout Silver Award Report Form</u>, have your leader sign it and mail it to your council.

	Step 1.	Decide which values, experience, and skills you would like to put into action through the Silver Award project:	
	Step 2.	Decide on a project that will use your personal strengths to help others. You can work with your school, the community, a religious group, or Girl Scouting.	
	Step 3.	Identify the people with whom you will work: Those who will help and guide you, those who will work with you, those whom you hope to help. Be sure to include a Girl Scout leader or another adult from your council:	
	Step 4.	Create a timeline and a budget, if necessary. If you work with a group, divide jobs and set up a way to ensure that everyone is on track:	
	Step 5.	Carry out your plan. This final step of your project should total at least seven hours. This may be done all on one day or divided into segments. When you have completed your project, write a brief evaluation. Share the evaluation with your adviser and council representative.
