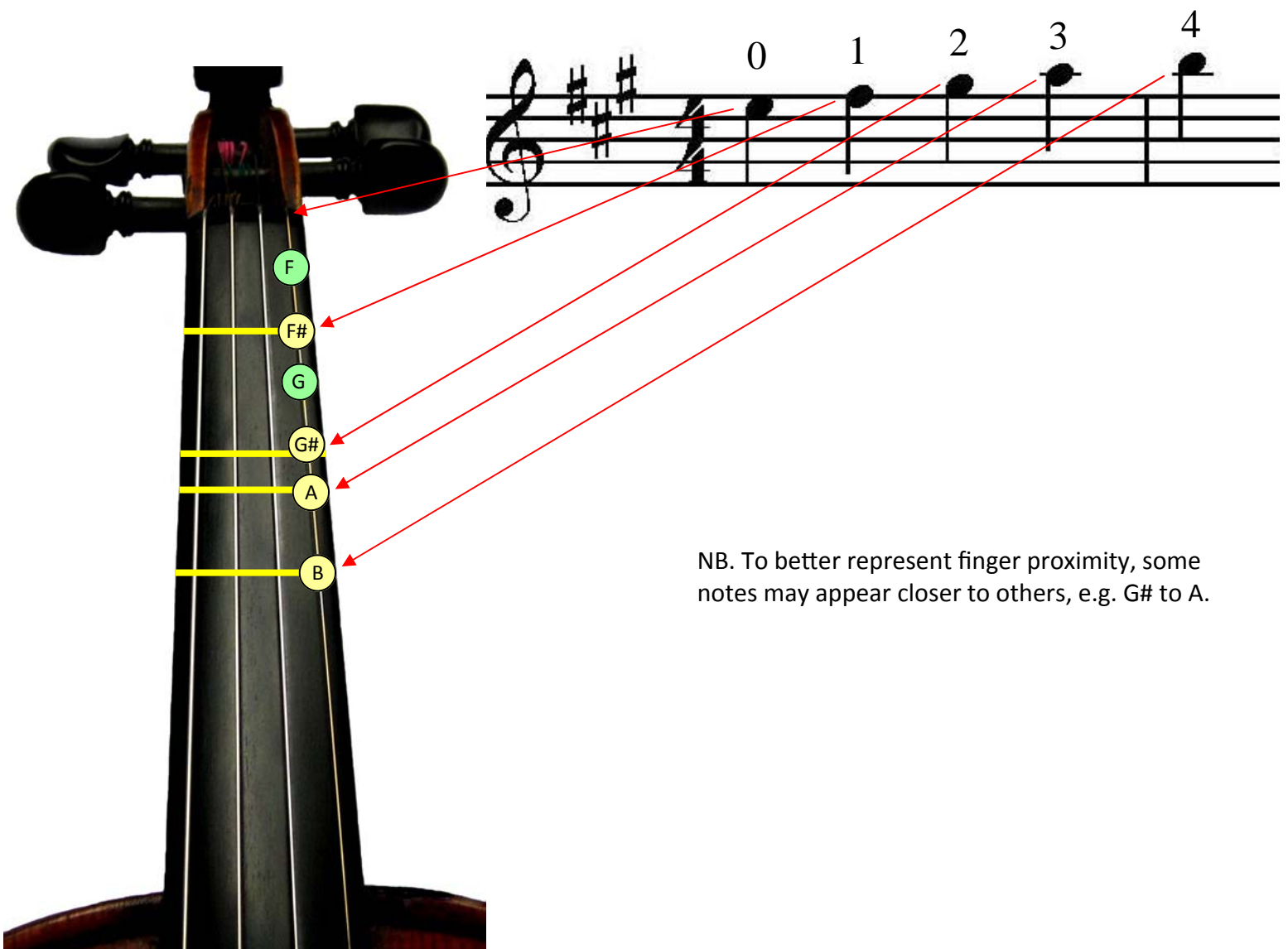


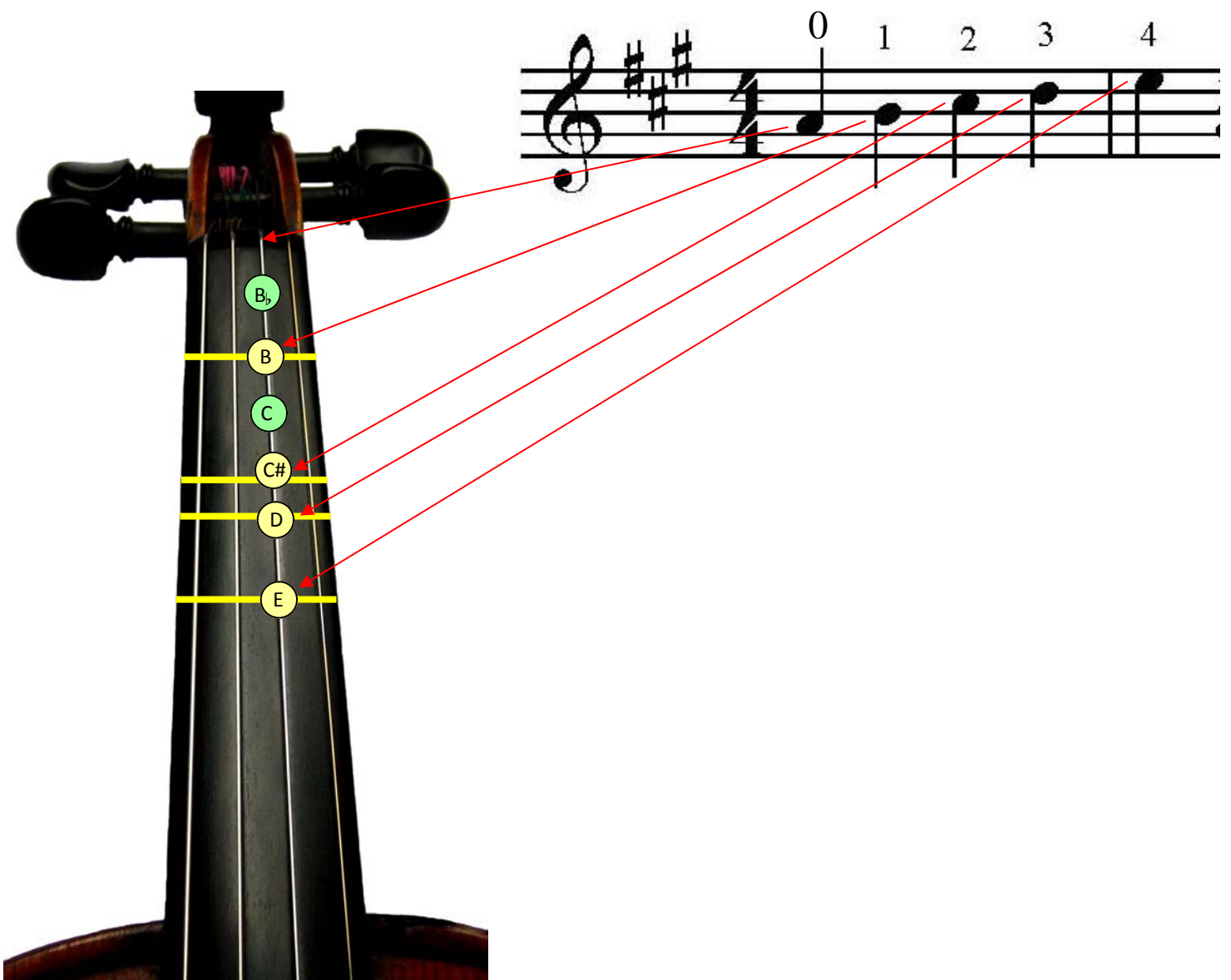
Violin Fingerboard Charts

E string (1st position, A major)

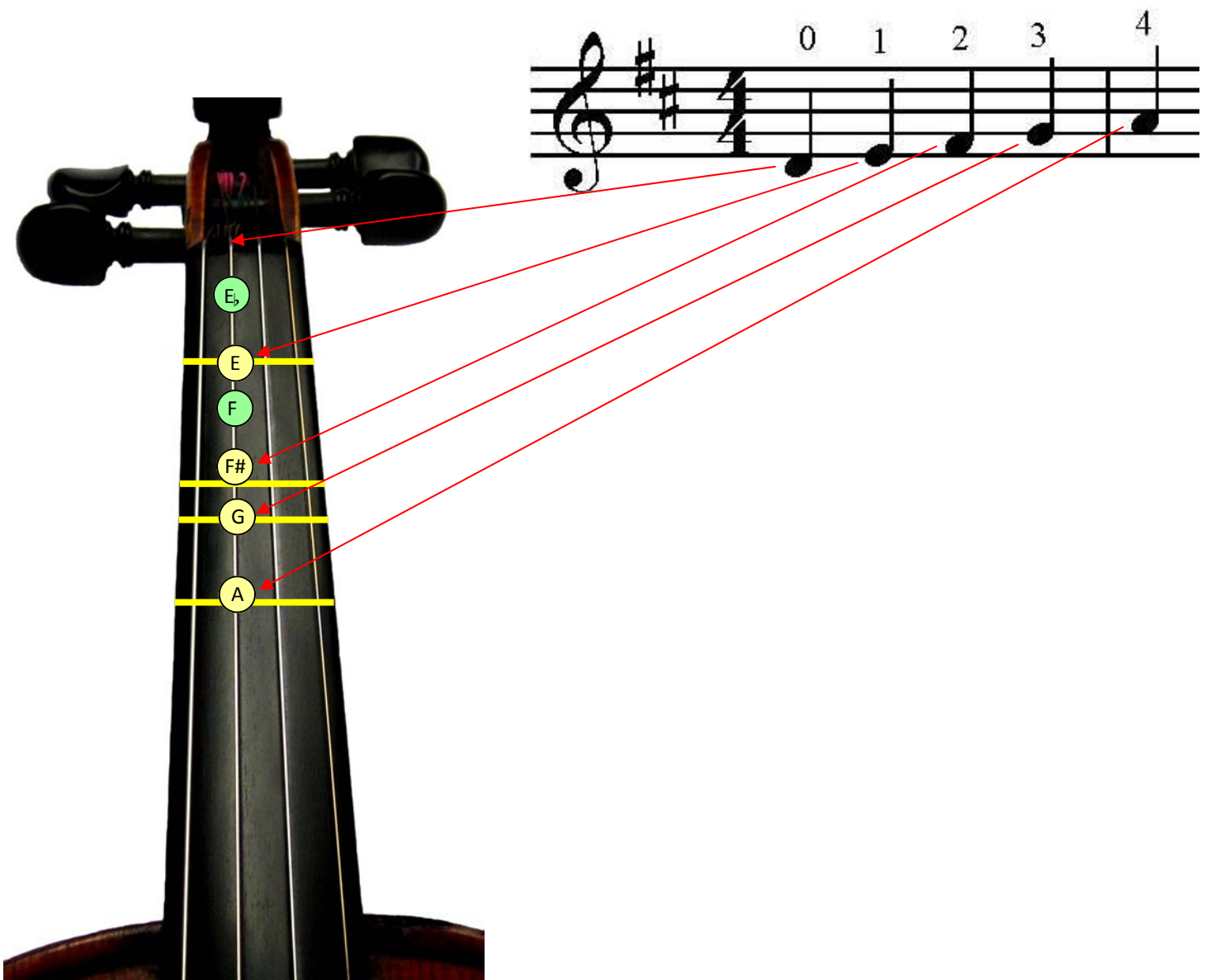


NB. To better represent finger proximity, some notes may appear closer to others, e.g. G# to A.

D string (1st position, D major)

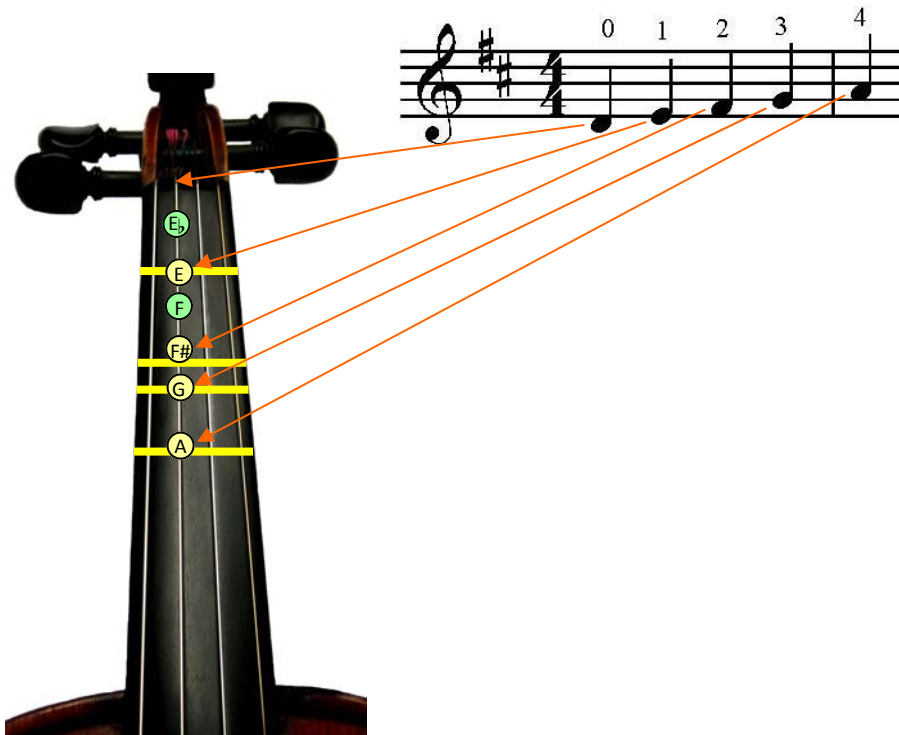


G string (1st position, G major)
